Entrance examination and interview

For us to be able to welcome you to Trinity next year, candidates must be over the age of 11, but be under the age of 12 in September 2025', Candidates must be over the age of 11 but be under 12 on 1 September at the proposed year of entry.

We understand that entrance examinations can be daunting for students and parents alike so it is important to know that all 10+, 11+, 13+ and 13+ pre-test candidates will sit both a computer-based assessment and written papers.

Computer based testing will consist of a 60-minute assessment comprising the following elements:

- Mathematics
- Non-Verbal Reasoning
- Verbal Reasoning
- English

The computer-based sections will be largely multiple choice and will not require typing or keyboard skills.

Written testing will cover the following:

- English Creative Writing (30 minutes)
- Maths Problem Solving (30 minutes)

It is important to us that all our potential pupils are comfortable, confident and able to do their best when they come to our exam days so we would recommend that applicants familiarise themselves with the style of testing before the exam day.

He will not need to prepare anything in advance and please be assured that it is our intention that his interview will be of a pastoral nature; above all, it is a fantastic opportunity to better get to know your son.
